PARTIAL BREAKING OFF SMOKING REDUCED BUT NOT CANCEL THIS RISK OF COMPLICATIONS

## RISKS ARE MAINLY:

Respiratory and cardiac complications with general sometimes lifethreatening Philebitis and pulmonary embolismPoor bone healingPoor integration of orthopaedic implants.

Delays wound healing or non-wound healing, intection of the surgical site.

AMONG YOUNG WOMEN, TORACCO ASSOCIATED WITH
CONTRACEPTIVE PILL AND / OR SECRET PRACTICE IS EXTREMELY.
